The individual will play a role in building the Vegetable and Strawberry Pathology Extension and Research Program and must be able to excel in a growing, dynamic, mutually-supportive team environment, participate in a safe and efficient work environment, participate in or lead mentorship of lab personnel, and effectively communicate using a variety of means with a range of audiences.
