


Murrieta Presentation Day Submitted By Beverly Wlimer




S.E.T. Science Fair Submitted By Susan Marsh

Poultry Report Submitted by Amanda Penicks

At our poultry meetings we continuously talk about biosecurity and the importance of knowing how your birds look or behave normally. You should never bring birds that are stressed or sick to a show. At local shows and fairs birds are checked and approved by a bio-security person or team. Open shows rely on the exhibitor's good faith to enter only healthy birds. In December an exhibitor from Arizona entered the Pacific Coast Bantam Club Show and contaminated the showroom with the disease Coryza.

Infectious Coryza is a respiratory disease of chickens caused by a bacterium. It spreads rapidly from bird to bird and is thought to be triggered by stress. Mortality (death) may be high but is usually low. Symptoms include an involvement of the sinuses and nasal passages with a nasal discharge and swelling of the face. Egg production drops. Birds with Coryza should be kept isolated from the flock. Sulfonamids are frequently used for treating Coryza.
